

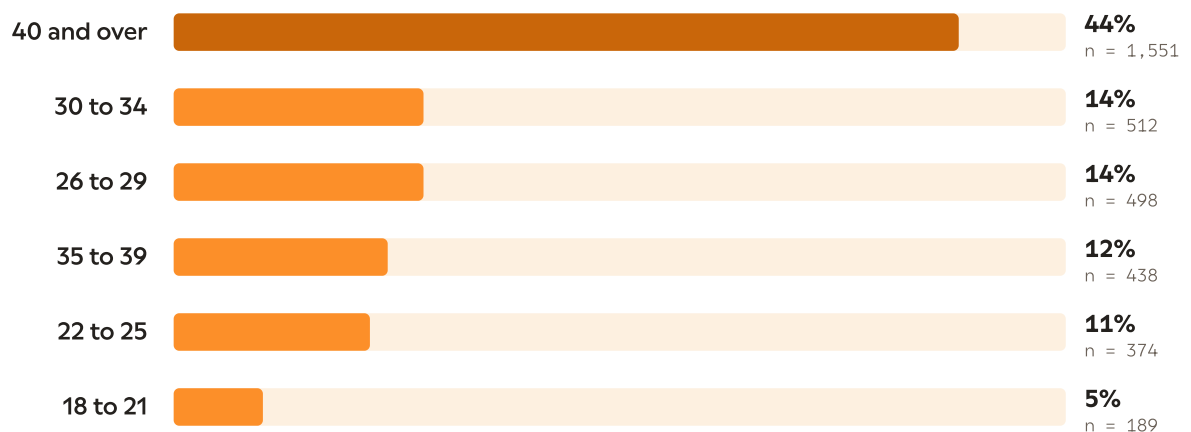
Chart pack

Five charts from The Sharehouse Generation 2026, a study of 3,562 Australians living in share accommodation, by Homerun with Flatmate Finders.

Using these charts. Free to reproduce with the attribution line printed under each one. The underlying study is not a representative sample of all Australian sharehouses: it is a study of Australians actively forming or reforming one, recruited through Flatmate Finders and Homerun in March and April 2026. Values are rounded to whole percentages, so some sets will not total exactly 100. The raw number of respondents behind each bar is shown beneath the percentage. Editable SVG and print resolution PNG of every chart are available on request, along with unrounded figures, question wording and full frequency tables.

CHART 1

Age of sharehouse residents

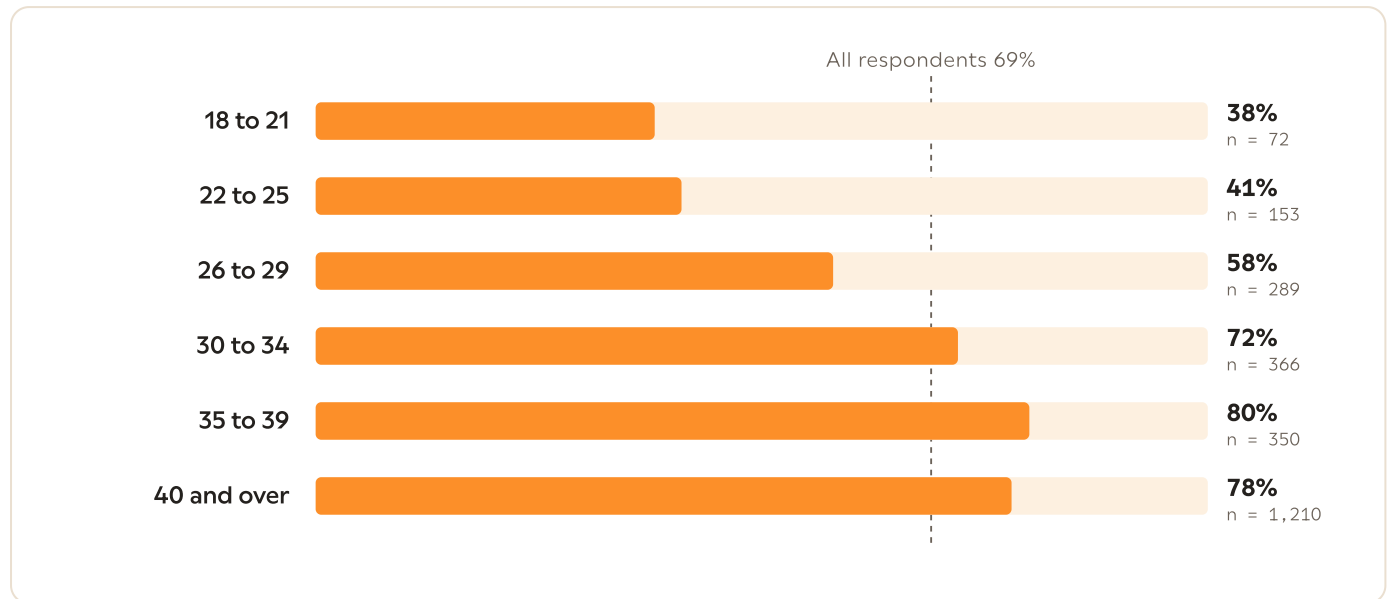


The single largest age group is 40 and over, at 44%. Every other band sits at or below 14%. This is the finding the whole report rests on.

Did not expect, when they were 20, to still be sharehousing at their current age

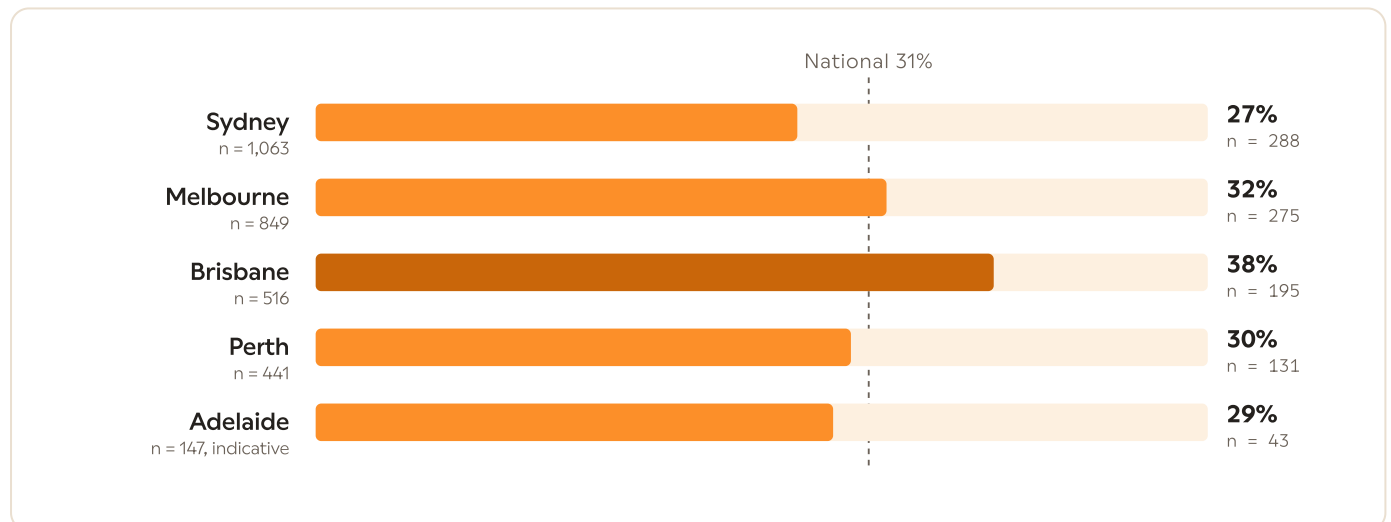


The expectation gap widens with every year of age until the late thirties, then plateaus. The dashed line is the figure across all respondents.

Do not expect to ever own a home, by capital

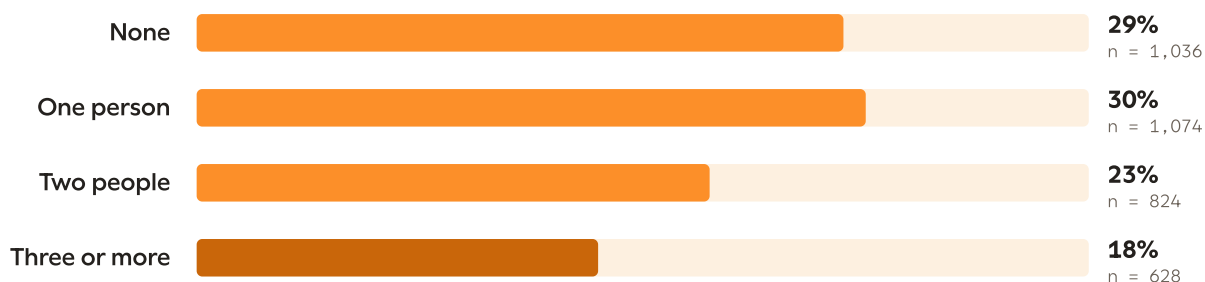


Brisbane sharers are the most likely in the country to say ownership will never happen. Adelaide sits on a base of 147 and is indicative only.

People who moved in or out in the last 12 months

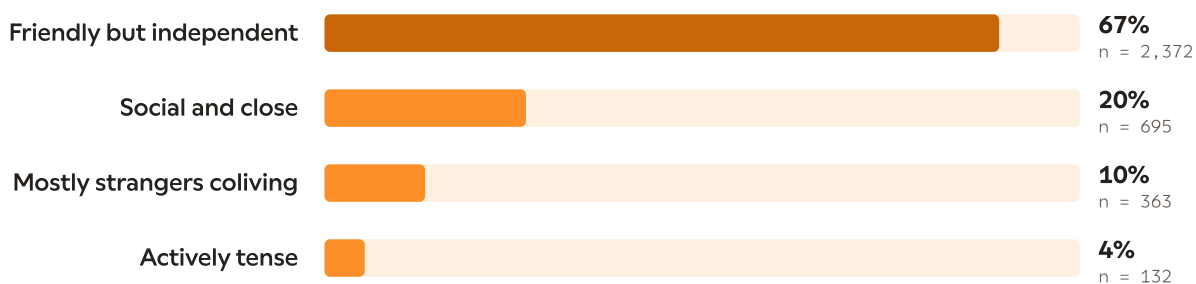


Seven in ten sharehouses changed at least one occupant in a year. Almost one in five changed three or more. Bars are the share of households reporting each count.
